



Objectives

1. To familiarize ourselves with the terms, shapes, styles, and functions of Greek pottery.
2. To express creatively our knowledge of Greek pottery.

Procedures

2. Choose one of the three shapes of Greek pottery that we have studied (amphora, hydria, kylix).
3. Choose a style of Greek pottery (geometric, black figure, red figure). Choose a scene to depict using this style – preferably it will be Classical, but it does not have to be.
4. Using clay, construct a Greek pot that incorporates the shape and style you have chosen.
