



## PROJECT: PHOTOJOURNAL OF ANCIENT ROMAN SITES

### Objectives

1. To learn about important buildings within the city of Rome itself.
2. To create a photojournal, either in print or electronic, documenting these sites.

### Procedures

1. Choose ten of the following famous sites in Rome.

Colosseum  
Mausoleum of Augustus  
Theatre of Pompey  
Basilica Julia  
Rostra  
Temple of Fortuna Virilis

Temple of the Deified Julius  
Theatre of Marcellus  
Temple of Venus and Rome  
Basilica Aemilia  
Domus Aurea  
Baths of Caracalla

Circus Maximus  
Mausoleum of Hadrian  
Forum Romanum  
Curia  
Pantheon  
Baths of Diocletian

2. Research the 10 sites that you have chosen. Find the “five W’s” about the site —WHO, WHAT, WHERE, WHEN, WHY. For example, who built it, for whom was it built, what is it, where in Rome is it located, when was it built, why was it built.

3. Create a “photojournal” documenting this information for each of the sites. Your photojournal may be a printed document or it may take the form of a website. Each page of your photojournal should concern a different site, and should include not only the five W’s but also a modern image (i.e. what does the site look like today) of the site. For five of the sites, you should also include an image that shows a reconstruction of the site (i.e. what did the site look like in Roman times).

4. Include a works cited page in which you cite the sources for your information and images.
